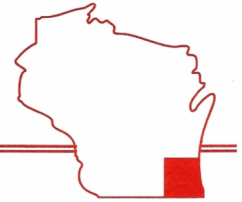

Questions for DSPS representatives at EIASEW March 7, 2012 meeting:

1. Does the DSPS have a mission statement? Where do you see the department in 1 year - 5 years?
2. What is the adoption status 2011 NEC adoption? What is causing the delay and when do you feel it will be adopted?
3. What is the status of the 2007 Wisconsin Act 63 (requiring electrical credentials)? Do you feel it will go into effect on April 1, 2013?
4. Is the UDC (Uniform Dwelling Code) council on its way to being eliminated?
5. Is the Commercial Code Council on its way to being eliminated?
6. What is the status of the 2011 Senate Bill 32 (Mini / Max) ?
7. Will DSPS continue to provide continuing education training... and at what capacity? Or will it just be phased out with the responsibility falling on associations and/or individuals to provide CEU training?

Related question: Municipalities are required to buy State UDC building permit seals. Funds from these seals have historically been designated towards training provided by the state to certified inspectors. Is this commitment still active?

8. What is the status/plans of the state's requirement regarding electrical certification by municipalities?
9. While funds for CEU training, credential renewal, plan reviews, etc. continue to be collected, DSPS staff and services appear to be dwindling. Please explain this apparent discrepancy, so that we can understand where these funds are now being used, and by whom.
